



6 – 7 June Editors' Lab Berlin Innovative Use Of Open Data To Cover Global Development

<u>The Editors' Lab Berlin</u> will be co-organized by Zeit Online and the Global Editors Network from 6 – 7 June and hosted at Zeit Online's headquarters. It is part of a series of <u>international hackdays</u> hosted by world-renowned newsrooms and supported by **Google** and the **Bill and Melinda Gates Foundation**.

The Editors' Lab Berlin will bring together teams representing the top tier of news media outlets from all platforms (broadcast, online, print). The confirmed teams include **DPA-Newslab**, **Sueddeutsche.de**, **Spiegel Online**, **Deutsche Welle**, **Berliner Morgenpost**, **NDR**, **Rhein-Zeitung**, and **Styria Media International**. Each team is composed of one journalist, one designer, and one developer who will create innovative apps, data journalism projects, and interactive content. The event is based on the theme of "Innovative Use Of Open Data To Cover Global Development."



The schedule during the two days will alternate between working sessions and the following masterclasses:

• "Innovative initiatives in the field of global development news" by Justin Arenstein, African Media Initiative

•"Ged Project: A new tool to cover Trade, Finance, Innovation, Labor and Ecology" by Jan Arpe, Bertelsmann Foundation

The Prizes For The Editors' Lab Berlin Winner

The champion of the Editors' Lab Berlin, chosen by the Editors' Lab Jury (Jan Arpe, Justin Arenstein, Sascha Venohr and Antoine Laurent), will compete

against the winning regional Editors' Lab teams from <u>Amsterdam</u>, <u>Argentina</u>, <u>Austria</u>, <u>Egypt</u>, <u>France</u>, Germany, <u>India</u>, and the <u>United States</u> during the <u>GEN</u> <u>News Hackathon</u>. This final stage of the Editors' Lab international tournament will occur during the <u>GEN News Summit</u> in Paris from June 19 – 21, 2013.

In addition to being invited to the GEN News Hackathon, the winning Editors' Lab Berlin team **will receive 5000 euros**.
